The lecture takes its cue from the tension between the earthly and the otherworldly, and in particular the tension between flesh and soul/spirit—tensions that have characterized, and perhaps even plagued, the Christian theological imagination. The lecture will then ask: To what extent has the widespread notion of the human as a rational animal reinforced this set of tensions in Christian theology? Can we think of human

being differently? This will then lead to another question, central for our considerations: How does Martin Luther's definition of humanity as justified reconfigure the problematic of body and spirit, and world and heaven? In all, the lecture will explore a fundamentally embodied nature of humanity and the possibilities for togetherness that emerge from this perspective.
